RESPIRATORY SYMPTOMS (persistent cough, head congestion, profuse runny nose, severe sore throat)	NO KNOWN EXPOSURE	WITH FEVER (temperature greater than 100.1 degrees F or higher) or WITHOUT FEVER (temperature less than 100.0 F without the aid of fever reducing medication such as Acetaminophen (Tylenol) or Ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin)	STAY HOME until symptoms resolved for a full 24 hours without the use of medications  Testing recommended. If positive test, see "symptoms+positive test" below	Do not need to submit proof of a negative test
NO SYMPTOMS	KNOWN EXPOSURE TO HOUSEHOLD CONTACT	WITHOUT FEVER	MAY ATTEND SCHOOL IF NO SYMPTOMS AND A NEGATIVE TEST, WEAR MASK TO SCHOOL for 10 days  TEST EVERY DAY for a full 10 days from household member's positive test.  IF SYMPTOMS DEVELOP or the exposed individual tests positive for COVID, see "symptoms+positive test" below.	Do not need to submit proof of negative test
ANY SYMPTOMS	KNOWN EXPOSURE	WITH OR WITHOUT FEVER	STAY HOME AND TEST DAILY If positive test result, see <u>"symptoms+positive test"</u> below If negative test result, remain home until resolution of symptoms and negative test. POSITIVE TEST WITH OR WITHOUT SYMPTOMS	KNOWN OR UNKNOWN EXPOSURE	WITH OR WITHOUT FEVER	STAY HOME IN ISOLATION (away from others, as possible) FOR A FULL FIVE DAYS. ("Day 1" is the first full day after a positive test result)	May report to school on "Day 6" with improvement of symptoms and wearing a mask through day 10.
