While enjoying your time together I encourage you to spend time reading with your family. Cuddling with a special person at the end of a day and sharing a story with each other is a wonderful ending to an active day! Additionally, it is a fun way to reinforce reading skills mastered in kindergarten and necessary in first grade. Keeping a journal is another activity that your future first grader may enjoy while reinforcing his or her language arts skills. Children are encouraged to use a calendar to record the day and date and use a clock to identify and record the time at the top of each journal page. Your child is then ready to record the day's activities. Journal entries may be pictures with a word or sentence describing it, a story/narrative telling about the day, items glued to a page that represent the day, or descriptions of books read (include title and author a brief description and why you liked the book/story). Remember that a word or sentence accompanying a picture, illustration or special item is always a nice addition. Math skills may be practiced and reinforced as your child experiences his day. Counting steps or items seen, identifying shapes of everyday items, building with blocks or legos, and adding numbers on a list are all activities that will help to reinforce math skills.

I have include a sight word list for you to review over the summer as well as some Number sentences to help keep your math skills sharp. I can't wait to see your completed work!n
