Welcome and Updates from Amy Dowding

- Amy stated that Rachel Ambrosio was unable to be at the meeting due to a prior family commitment.
- Amy opened the meeting with a prayer.
- Land's End informed the school that they have discontinued a pair of our uniform pants and shorts for girls and boys due to the material used. New regulations will take effect in about two years that will restrict the use of the old material due to chemicals that have been deemed unsafe. Land's End has made the decision to discontinue the use of the material prior to the new regulations taking effect. Amy passed around a sample pair of pants made from the new material. The pants feel lighter and are a slightly different style with a zippered pocket on one side.
- We will change to spring uniforms after spring break. There will be a uniform swap scheduled prior to break.
- The World Language Expo is next Friday, March 8th from 8-10am in the Hall. The middle school students will present information and provide a food item from a Spanish or French speaking country that they have researched. Younger students will also participate with their classes. Parents are encouraged to attend. (UPDATE 3/3/24: Please refer to the revised newsletter sent on Saturday 3/2 for the K-5 schedule. - Parents will receive the schedule for IOWA testing in the next week or two. An email
 will be sent from Rachel with the information. The school encourages parents to have
 students get enough sleep and a good breakfast prior to testing so the students can do
 their best.
- Calendar Reminders and Updates:
 - School will be closed on March 21st due to a Diocesan wide teacher retreat.
 - o There will be no school on 3/28-4/1 for Holy Week and Easter.
 - \circ Spring break is separate from Easter this year and will be 4/15-4/19.
 - The school calendar has been updated to reflect the new last day of school which is Tuesday, 6/18. The 8th grade graduation will remain on Friday, 6/7.

8th Grade Capstone Presentations—Jeanette Campo

- Jeanette explained the Capstone Program and the process.
 - o The projects must teach someone or help someone.
 - Students begin with a personal inventory that will lead them to two project ideas.
 - Fundraising and collections alone are not enough for the project. The students must be more actively involved.
 - o In February, students presented their projects to the Capstone Board and use feedback from the board to make modifications as needed.
 - The projects are created by the students and a reflection of a passion or a connection they have. As a result, even students who are not initially thrilled with the idea of a Capstone Project end up really enjoying the process and their project.
 - O Alumni have commented that the Capstone Project has helped them feel more prepared for college and job interviews, gives them the confidence to start a club at their high school or college, and provides them with the necessary skills to communicate with adults in an effective and professional manner.
- 8th Graders Meredith and Phoebe presented their Capstone Porjects to attendees.
 - Meredith's project focused on bringing awareness and helping individuals with Functional Neurologic Disorder (FND), also known as Conversion Disorder. She chose this project as a result of a personal connection to the condition.
 - Phoebe's project was developed from her passion for field hockey and lacrosse and her understanding that many individuals are unable to play these sports because they are cannot afford the necessary equipment.
